The Ship of Zion

Look on Zion, the city of our festivals; your eyes will see Jerusalem, a peaceful abode, a tent that will not be moved; its stakes will never be pulled up, nor any of its ropes brken. There the Lord will be our Mighty One. It will be like a place of broad rivers and streams. No galley with oars will ride them, no mighty ship will sail them. For the Lord is our judge, the Lord is our lawgiver, the Lord is our king; it is he who will save us. [Now] your rigging hangs loose: The mast is not held secure, the sail is not spread. Then an abundance of spoils will be divided and even the lame will carry off plunder. No one living in Zion will say, "I am ill"; and the sins of those who dwell there will be forgiven.

Isaiah 33:20-24

This summer at Allen Avenue, we've been continuing to hear about lighthouses. God's word is filled with images of his light and how he calls people back to himself through the light of the gospel.

Less often in scripture, God chooses the imagery of ships to communicate to lost and fallen people. Yet, when saving Noah and his family, calling his disciples to be "fishers of men," and reminding us that the sign of Jonah would be the only sign for a sinful generation—God spoke both warning and hope to those tossed about like waves on the sea (James 1:6). In Isaiah 33, the image we're given of Zion—the city of Jerusalem—might seem odd. It's an image of a ship. Settled on top of inland hills next to the desert, God's chosen dwelling place on earth is compared to a tent that can't be moved with ropes



that can't be broken. Even though the "ship" of Jerusalem has a "mast [that is] not held secure," and "the sail is not spread," God still paints a triumphant picture of a future Jerusalem. At that time, Zion isn't under siege but becomes a war ship that "will carry off plunder."

This ship of Zion, which will become sea-worthy again, is not like the war-horses of Egypt or the plundering armies of Assyria. It's festivals and laws are not what saves it; it's true king will bring about this future. A future with healed diseases and forgiven sins. A future that will draw all peoples to the light of God's eternal dwelling. Where the sea will be no more. Where there will be no more sun by day or moon by night, "for the LORD will be your everlasting light."

May we hoist our sails and follow course to this coming kingdom of God, in whom Jesus Christ himself dwells as our eternal King and LORD.










Walk with Jesus from the arrest to the tomb.

By financially supporting the ministry of Love INC, Allen Avenue is helping its mission to serve families and transform lives In the Name of Christ.


